Annual Tips

Fertilization: Most annuals do not require high levels of fertilizer. About 6-8 weeks after planting, apply one quarter the recommended amount to the planting bed.

Watering: Deep, infrequent watering is much preferred over frequent, light watering.

Mulching: After planting annuals, it is suggested that a 2-3 inch layer of mulch be applied around the plants.

Weeding: Weeds should be removed as soon as you see them.

Hanging Basket Care Tips

<p style="text-align: center;">The Right Light</p> <p>Most flowering hanging baskets will tolerate a wide range of light conditions, though some will balk at the heat and drying of the all day sunlight or the dimness of all-day shade. Match your plant with its light location for best results.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Watering Before Wilting</p> <p>Don't wait for wilting as your cue to water. Flowering plants do best if you never allow them to wilt. Take extra care with watering since hanging plants dry out faster than garden plants, because they're exposed to more wind and warmer temperatures.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Be Sure To Water Thoroughly</p> <p>If the basket dries out, the soil may shrink and allow the water to quickly run out the drain hole, fooling you into thinking it's thoroughly watered when, in fact, the water is bypassing the roots. Make sure the basket becomes heavy with water, about 7 to 9 lbs. You may need to re-water the basket again in 15 minutes - or soak it in a bucket of water for 5 to 10 minutes to thoroughly moisten the soil.</p>

Basil	
African Blue	Hardier hybrid between dark opal and camphor basil. Attractive purplish-blue cast; strong growth habit. (A)
Cinnamon	Strong growth habit! Spicy cinnamon scent. (A)
Magical Michael	Ornamental, aromatic, and edible. Good in salads, pesto, garnish, and most dishes, which use other basil. (A)
Purple Ruffles	18" Unique purple ruffled highly fragrant leaves. (A)
Spicy Globe	An attractive form of bush basil with larger leaves and uniform dense globular little bushes (A)
Sweet Dani	All American Selections Winner, 70-75% more essential oils than common lemon basil. Enhanced culinary value. (A)
Sweet Italian	Leaves used for flavoring tomato dishes. (A)
Bay Laurel	Grown from seed, one of the most sought-after culinary herbs. Grow indoors in winter. Use leaves to flavor meat, soups, and stews. Slow growth habit (TP) Zones 8-10
Borage	Known as the herb of gladness. Flavors salads and teas. (A)
Calamint Variegated	Green foliage with white splashes, mint scented. Use in tea, peas, and pork. (P) Zone 5-10
Catnip	Favorite of cat lovers; also promotes good sleep (tea) and is used as a cold/fever remedy. (P) Zones 5-9
Chamomile (Roman)	Traditional ground cover in English gardens and pathways. (P) Zones 5-9
Chives	Onion chives, blooms can be used to add color and flavor to salads. (P) Zones 3-9
Chives, Garlic	Similar to regular Chives, but with Garlic flavor (P) Zones 3-9
Cilantro/ Coriander	Mexican or Chinese Parsley; essential for salsa & Chinese dishes. Use ground seeds to flavor pastries, sausages, curry powder, pickling. (A)
Comfrey	Leafy stems, large leaves, hollow stems. Used for external remedy for bruises, sprains, swellings and soothing pain. 2-3' in height (P) Zones 3-8
Curry Plant	Curry-scented foliage. Used to enhance fruit flavors in confections and perfumes. (TP) Zones 8-9
Dill Fernleaf	Dwarf, 18" tall; provides extended cutting season; slow to seed. (A)
Feverfew	Used to ease occurrences and severity of migraine headaches. Also as a relief from arthritis. (P) Zones 5-9
French Tarragon	Used to flavor fish, cheese, eggs, almost any vegetable. Essential in Béarnaise Sauce and Eggs Benedict. (P) Zones 4-7
Lavender	
Lady	Flowers consistently in the first year. Lavender-blue flowers. (P) Zones 4-9
Munstead	Deep lavender color. Use in borders and sachets. (P) Zones 4-9
Lemon Balm	Lemon scented foliage is used in teas, salads, and soups. (P) Zone 5-9
Lemon Verbena	Strongly aromatic, use as a substitute for lemon. (TP) Zones 8-10
Marjoram (Sweet)	Flavor meats, salads, soups, sauces, vinegar, vegetables, teas, jellies. (TP) Zones 11+
Menthol Plant	Strong Menthol scent (TP) Zones 11+

Apple	Light green rounded leaves make refreshing sorbet. (P) Zones 5-9
Banana	From France, strong banana scent. (P) Zones 5-9
Chocolate	Striking 'Peppermint Patty' Scent (P) Zones 4-9
Corsican	Dense evergreen leaves are excellent for a rock garden. (TP) Zones 7-9
Ginger	Gold-flecked leaves have a fruity fragrance and flavor with a hint of ginger. (TP) Zones 6-9
Kentucky Col. Spearmint	The best cooking mint, great for tea. (P) Zones 5-9
Orange	Treasured for its very special fragrance. Adds a hint of citrus to punches, teas, and potpourris. (P) Zones 4-9
Peppermint	A refreshing alternative to regular coffee and tea. (P) Zones 5-9
Pineapple	Variegated leaves with a pineapple fragrance when young. (TP) Zones 6-9
Oregano	
Cuban	Fleshy small almost round leaves with shallow teeth on the edges. Scent similar to the oreganos. Attractive houseplant. (TP) Zones 11+

Oregano	
Dittany of Crete	Woolly-leaved relative Oregano with similar spicy scent and uses. Excellent for hanging baskets. (TP) 8-11
Greek	True oregano gathered from the mountains of Greece. Excellent flavor. (P) Zones 5-11
Mexican	Often sold as true oregano in Mexico and the southern U.S. Great with Mexican dishes. (TP) Zones 9-11
Parsley	
Green River	Dark green, double curled leaves; vigorous plants recover quickly after cutting. (A)
Plain Italian	Dark green, best type for flavoring. (A)
Patchouli	Definitive perfume of India and the orient. Sandalwood scent (TP) Zones 11+
Rosemary	Evergreen leaves used for seasoning meats; blue flowers. Used throughout the Orient and India in perfumes, inks, and soaps. Reminiscent smell from the "hippie culture" of the late 60's and early 70's. (TP) Zones 8-11
Sage	
Berggarten	Large gray-blue leaves, robust low-growth habit. (P) Zones 5-8
Golden	Same uses are regular garden save, but with more attractive chartreuse-yellow foliage. (TP) Zones 7-9
Pineapple	Leaves, when rubbed, emit a truly pineapple fragrance. (TP) Zones 6-9
Purple	Aromatic purple foliage. Must be mulched in winter. (TP) Zones 6-9
Russian	Shrub-like plant has fine fragrant silver-gray foliage. Blue flowers cover long stems in late summer. Resembles lavender. Use in beds and for borders. (P) Zones 5-9
Tricolor	Aromatic foliage with white and pink streaks. Mulch in winter.
Savory, Summer	Delicate flavor used to flavor peas, beans, vegetable, juices, stuffing, and meatloaf. (A)
Savory, Winter	Strong pungent flavor. Attractive low bush for borders and edgings. (P) Zones 5-9
Stevia	Sugar substitute, 100x sweeter than sugar, but no calories. Use leaf powder in place of sugar in drinks, deserts, preserves, anywhere you would normally use sugar. (TP) Zones 11+
Thyme	
Broadleaf	From tropical America, unlike other thymes, this has large fleshy leaves. A keynote flavor in Jamaican cuisine. (TP) Zone 11+
Broadleaf Var.	Trailing with variegated green/cream foliage. Aromatic. (TP) Zone 11+
English	6" tall. Widely used seasoning and border herb. (P) Zones 4-9
Lemon	Small creeping dark green leaves with excellent lemon flavor. (P) Zones 4-9

Here are time-tested guidelines to cooking with herbs.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Add most herbs about thirty minutes before the end of cooking time. Simmer them slowly with the food to release the flavor and retain the volatile oils. • Dried herbs are more potent than fresh – one teaspoon dried equals one tablespoon fresh. • Experiment with herbs! Try them in old recipes, taste new ones, combine herbs. • Use moderation. Some herbs may be overpowering if too much is used. Familiarize yourself with the strongly flavored ones – sage, rosemary, thyme, and oregano.

Herb Culture

When using herbs for culinary purposes, harvesting should be done before the plants blossom. This encourages the development of new growth and allows a second and even a third cutting. The best time to harvest is in the morning while the essential oils are still concentrated. If it is necessary to wash the herbs, rinse them gently in clear water and let them drip-dry in a basket. If drying for a later use, use as little heat as possible to preserve the aromatic oils.

Gardening Tip

Brighten up your summer salads with edible flowers. Some of the most popular varieties are Nasturtium, Calendula, Pansy, Impatiens and Petunia. Pick flowers that have just opened for the best flavor, and simply sprinkle fresh blooms or petals on salads, or use them to adorn cheesecakes or other goodies.

Perennial Tips

1. Most perennials prefer soils that are well drained and high in organic matter. Many varieties that can tolerate poor soil conditions will thrive in richer soil.
2. Trimming dead flowers and damaged parts during the growing season helps to conserve the plant's strength. This can extend the growing season of most perennials.
3. While perennials are still small, hand-weed or hoe lightly in-between your plants to prevent weeds from becoming established. As your perennials grow and spread, there will be fewer weeds. A mulch of bark, applied to bare soil, and spread in-between plants will also help prevent weed development and will conserve moisture.
4. After the first killing frost remove all dead foliage to reduce disease and prevent areas where insects can winterize. To protect perennials from the winter, cover your plants with a layer of leaves. Place evergreen branches over the leaves to prevent the leaves from blowing away, and to keep plants dry.

Planting Instructions: Seed potatoes may be planted when soil temperatures reach 50 degrees F. Cut seed potatoes into sections including 2-3 eyes in each section. Each section should be a minimum of 1-1/2" to 2" or larger. A 6oz potato will generally make 3-4 pieces. Small seed potatoes do not need cutting. Cut pieces should be allowed to dry for 7-10 days before planting, but can be planted after cutting if necessary. Place cut parts of tubers in rows 4" deep and 12-18" apart in rows spaced 2-3' apart. If planting in beds space plants 12-15" apart in both directions. Potatoes will sprout when the conditions are correct.

Potato Tips

1. Do not store potatoes in the refrigerator. Refrigeration converts the starch in potatoes to sugar which will cause the potato to darken when cooked.
2. Prolonged exposure to light causes greening and makes the potato taste bitter. Peel or pare green area from the potato before using.

PEPPERS: ALWAYS SO REWARDING!

Peppers absolutely demand warm weather, as they are more susceptible to cold weather damage than tomatoes. Never rush transplanting of seedlings to the garden. Be certain all danger of frost and cold weather has passed. Peppers thrive best in soils rich in organic matter, with adequate moisture. They should be grown in full sun, and caution should be exercised in the application of fertilizers containing nitrogen, as plants will tend to produce excess foliage rather than fruits.

Tomato Plants



The “determinate” (D) or “bush” varieties are those that reach a certain plant height and then stop growing, with most fruit borne over a four to six week period.

“Indeterminate” (I) varieties continue to grow and flower throughout the season, but have less mature fruits at any one time. More recently “Indeterminate Short Internode” (ISI) varieties have been developed, which combine the controlled growth habit of a “determinate” with the unlimited production potential of an “indeterminate.”

Tomato Transplanting & Culture Tips

When transplanting hardened-off tomato plants to the garden, choose a cloudy, wind-free day, if possible, or plant in the late afternoon. Water plants thoroughly about one-half hour prior to planting, using a full-strength solution of water-soluble fertilizer. Plants should be set in deeper than they originally were in the containers. Since tomato plants root freely from any portion of the stems buried beneath the soil, they may be planted down to the first leaves. Even if some of your plants have become leggy, dig out furrows and lay in the plants, burying excessively tall stems. Partially fill the hole with soil to within about 3" of the surface and water in thoroughly, being careful to settle soil around roots, eliminating air pockets. Finish filling the hole with soil and firm soil around stem.

Keeping plants well watered during the growing season, particularly during periods of drought, will help ensure better yields and help control problems such as blossom end-rot. Blossom end-rot is a blackening of the fruit on the blossom end due to a calcium deficiency often related to water uptake. Proper soil testing, lime applications and foliar treatment with calcium solutions like our "Yield Booster" will also help avoid this problem.

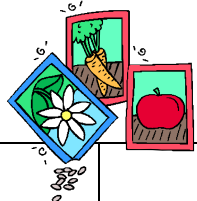

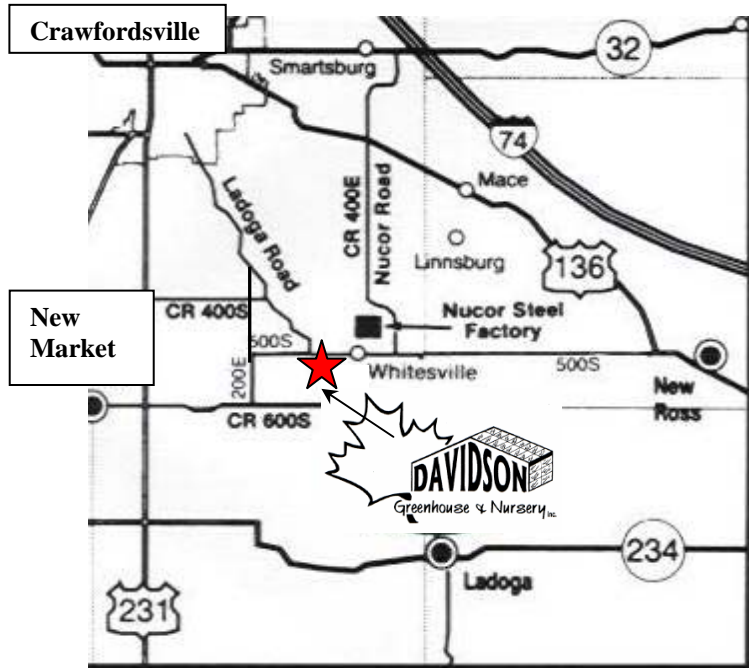
